

Philippines' Performance in Major International Competitions

Olympic Games

The Philippines debuted in the Olympic Games in 1924 at Paris with a one-athlete, one-official delegation. Philippines was one of the 44 countries.

In 1932, the Philippines' harvest trebled. Another bronze medal was bagged in 1936.

From 1948 to 1960, the Philippines was shut out of the medal tally. In 1964, the first silver medal was copped by boxer Anthony Villanueva, whose father Cely, a boxer, contributed a bronze in 1932.

Two boxers gave the country a medal each in 1988 and 1992. Onyok Velasco, whose elder brother Ruel won a bronze four years earlier, snatched the second silver medal.

Over 68 years and 16 Olympic Games, the Philippines has tallied two (2) silver and seven (7) bronze medals, five from boxers, two from athletics and two from swimming (same swimmer).
